THE HARMONY OF THE GOSPELS: The Three Temple Cleansings

The Gospel of John charts Jesus' ministry within three Passovers. The first was the first year of His ministry in AD 28 (Jn 2:13). The second was the next year, AD 29, when He fed the 5,000 men and later gave His Bread of Life Discourse (Jn 6:1-15, 22-71), and the third Passover was during the last week of His life in AD 30 (Jn 12:1).

Near Passover in AD 28: Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money-changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house	Palm Sunday, Nisan 10 th , 5 days before the Passover in AD 30: The crowds preceding him and those following kept crying out and saying: "Hosanna to the Son of David" (Mt 21:9). This is why Scripture records that Jesus was in the grave three days from Friday to Sunday before His Resurrection and why Wisdom 7:1-2 records that a child became flesh in the mother's womb for 10 months.
