SUMMARY OUTLINE OF THE BOOK OF JOB

The prose prologue in Chapters 1:1-2:13 introduces Job, his family, and friends. It also presents the book's theme in the exchanges between Job and his friends, which is how God can allow the innocent to suffer. There are three scenes in the Prologue:

- 1. The reader is introduced to Job and reads about his good qualities, children, and comfortable life (1:1-5).
- 2. The conversation between God and Satan resulting in Job's tests (1:6-2:10).
- 3. The arrival of Job's friends (2:11-13).
