Handout: Numbers Lesson 7

The creation of the holy nation of Israel is a story told in three acts:

- Act I: the Exodus liberation and journey to Mt. Sinai
- Act II: the covenant ratification, the giving of the Law and the journey from Sinai to Kadesh-Barnea
- Act III: the birth of a new generation in the wilderness years and their preparation to conquer the Promised Land on the Plains of Moab

Chapter 14 is divided into four parts:

- 1. Israel's rebellion (verses 1-9).
- 2. God's anger and Moses' intercession (verses 10-19).
- 3. Yahweh's judgment and the people's punishment (verses 20-38).
- 4. The abortive attempt to conquer Canaan (verses 39-45).

Chapter 15 is divided into three parts:

- 1. Laws that will take effect when the people live in Canaan (verses 1-21)
- 2. Laws concerning unintentional and intentional sins and a judgment for the intentional sin of working on the Sabbath (verses 22-36)
- 3. A reminder of the need for obedience and separateness from the Gentile world (verses 37-41)

The Series of Seven Laws in Numbers 15:1-31:

- 1. The law for grain offerings and wine libations with each lamb (verses 3-5).
- 2. The law for grain offerings and wine libations with a ram (verse 6).
- 3. The law for grain offerings and wine libations with a young bull (verses 7-9).
- 4. The law for offering the first-fruits of the bread dough to God (verses 17-21).
- 5. The law for the unintentional sin offering of the whole community (verses 22-26).
- 6. The law for the unintentional sin offering of an individual (verses 27-29).
- 7. The law for imposing exile for a defiant sin (verses 30-31).
